Where the money goes...

The Nicola Corry Support Foundation issues grants to families coping with cancer and because of our successful fund raising and extremely generous donations we haven't had to say NO to any legitimate application yet! We have given over **£125,000** during our 10 years as a registered charity.

The families we are helping are going through such an enormous battle, we try to cover the small things so they can focus on beating cancer! The following letter highlights the struggle of one family and how we have been able to help....

Dear Mary

I am writing to thank the Nicola Corry Support Foundation so very very much for the grant which you awarded me in the summer of last year.

I am so sorry that it's taken me this long to thank you, but my treatment etc has taken over everything so my admin has taken a back seat!

I have Leukaemia and following a stem cell transplant in Bristol last year I had to stay in Bristol for a hundred days to stay close to the hospital. The NHS paid for a one bedroom flat for myself and one carer, but this meant that there was no room to have my 7 year old daughter to come and stay with me. Your extremely generous grant enabled me to upgrade to a 2 bedroom flat, which meant that not only could my daughter come and stay at weekends, but she was also able to spend the whole summer holidays with me! You cannot imagine how special that was after me spending 20 weeks in hospital during the first half of the year! It gave us much needed and precious time time together which would have not happened without your grant, so I cannot thank you enough!

Dealing with cancer at any time and in any situation is always going to be an incredibly difficult time, however having a young child to think about throughout this journey brings so many more difficulties and emotions, and being a single parent too makes this even harder. It means the world to know that there is charity set up specifically for young families facing the sheer hell that a cancer diagnosis brings, and your grant certainly made a significant difference to our journey, which we are so very grateful for. Thank you so much.
