Super Human Brothers Battle the Sahara Desert!

Two brothers from Stow on the Wold decided to take on the biggest challenge we have ever seen. Alex Davenport-Jones and Nick Jones signed up to the mighty Marathon des Sables which is a torturous trek across the Sahara Desert as they wanted to raise money for charity. They endured a rigorous 16 month training regime to prepare themselves for the colossal challenge ahead.

On Thursday 6th April 2017 they flew off into the sunset to start their epic journey. The multi-day 'ultra-marathon' event spanned over six days during which an enormous 254km had to be covered. Alex and Nick tested their training and ran the tough terrain in temperatures of up to 60°C, with the longest stretch being 91km in one day! The brothers absolutely smashed it and successfully completed the immense mission with smiles on their faces! Alex reported "You were all very much at the forefront of our thoughts during this memorable week".



Alex and Nick's chosen charities are the Nicola Corry Support Foundation (NCSF) and World Cancer Research Fund (WCRF

UK), the charities are close to their hearts as Alex's, soon to be wife, Sally had cancer and both charities were able to offer her support and guidance through her tough battle. They set a target of an enormous £40,000 to be split between the two charities which has almost been met, which is totally awesome. Thank you so much for your extremely kind generally it is massively appreciated and will help me and my Lamily no end. It has token abot of preserve aff over the next few months which going through chamo.


"Dear Nicola Corry Support Foundation (Mary)

My daughter's summer school holiday will certainly be better because of your kind donation and I will be able to get the rest I need to be able to recover fully. I can't thank you enough".
