The Nicola Corry Support Foundation has very little admin costs and our wonderful team are all volunteers, which means we can give almost all of the money raised to families coping with cancer, here are some thank-yous from people we have been able to help.....

Dear Mary and the other trustees,

THANK YOU

so, so much for your kindness. We have been very touched and are extremely grateful.

With the end of 2014 (a pretty horrible year) and the start of 2015 which also seems set to be pretty hard, we have been thinking of how it has been and will be and feeling so incredibly lucky to have our young family. The daily (and hourly) ups and downs of bringing up young children is the most wonderful distraction and gives each day a momentum that we are very thankful for. One minute having a tearful moment thinking of the future and the next minute pretending to be a 'tickle robot' or diffusing a 'disaster' like having given them the wrong coloured socks!

Keeping their world safe and loving is our number one priority; thank you so much for helping us do that.



*"I just wanted to mail and say a huge thank you to yourself and everyone at the Nicola Corry Support Foundation. I was incredibly fortunate to be awarded a grant towards costs associated with staying away at Bristol for my ongoing treatment and received the grant just before Christmas. I cannot fully explain how dramatically this changed our Christmas other then to say thank you ever so much.* 

Your grant came at the end of a gruelling cycle of two lots of high dose chemotherapy followed by stem cell transplants. Due to the treatment I was placed in isolation to help avoid the chance of contracting any illness which due to my weakened immune system could have had serious implications. I spent a total of 6 weeks in isolation with visits from my wife and son when they could travel down. This placed considerable strain on us all both financially and emotionally. Thankfully I was able to leave hospital just before Christmas and whilst we knew there was nothing left in the pot so to speak I was overjoyed just to be home. Then your grant came in the post. Being able to pay off some of the costs associated with my treatment and buy a Christmas tree and some small gifts for my son transformed Christmas and help forget, albeit for a short time, the incredibly difficult year we have had as a family. I cannot thank you enough and the words do not seem to do enough justice to how you transformed our Christmas and gave us some light at the end of a dark year.

Rest assured your kindness and support will never be forgotten. My wife had already decided to partake in some charity events this year and we will without a doubt look to support the Nicola Corry Support Foundation. I hope to join her later this year too whatever the outcome of my impending surgery is.

Once again thank you and I wish you and all your team the very best for 2015".



Dear Mary and the Nicola Corry Support Foundation,

Thank you all so much for helping towards the cost of my 2 year old son so that he is able to attend full time pre-school. He really loves it. I felt very sad that he had to attend full time due to my illness and treatment but he really loves it so this has taken the sadness away. My 5 year old son loves school and he is about to start seeing a play therapist weekly to help him at the difficult time. I am at present having Radiotherapy daily and waiting to see if this works. My last day for treatment is 30yh Jan. Also I would like to thank you for the £200 Christmas present you gave, it was lovely. I was in Intensive care for 3 weeks in the lead up to Christmas but was finally allowed home on Christmas Eve so this Christmas was very special.

I do not have a prognosis as my Leukaemia is very rare and this time it is in my bones as well as blood but with the help of charities and foundations such as yourselves it makes my children's lives a little easier and a lot more positive.
