

He seems to be settling in well, as he has been able to spend most of his life so far with his Mum and Dad around most of the time. I have been told a number of times when picking him up from nursery what an infectious laugh he has. One little story is that he was laughing so hard at one of the staff fooling around that he fell off his chair!"


Our hearts go out to Nick and Theo at this hard time.

Other fundraising events held during 2011


Ladies Night at Trinity School, Portishead
